Wound Care Center and Hyperbaric Services at Atrium Medical Center earns national award for clinical excellence

MIDDLETOWN, Ohio (March 26, 2019) – The Wound Care Center and Hyperbaric Services at Atrium Medical Center has been recognized with a national award for clinical excellence.

The "Robert A. Warriner III, M.D., Center of Excellence" award was presented by Healogics, the nation's leading and largest wound care management company.

The award recognizes outstanding clinical outcomes for at least two consecutive years, including patient satisfaction higher than 92 percent, and a wound healing rate of at least 91 percent in less than 30 median days.

Chronic wounds affect millions of people in the U.S. The Wound Care Center and Hyperbaric Services at Atrium opened in 2015 and has provided more than 1,400 patients specialized treatment, often preventing amputations and helping patients return to active lives.

"This award means patients of the Wound Care Center and Hyperbaric Services at Atrium are receiving an award-winning level of care available close to home for residents in the Butler and Warren county areas," said Daniel Butler, MD, co-medical director of the Wound Care Center at Atrium.

The Center offers highly specialized wound care to patients suffering from diabetic ulcers, pressure ulcers, infections and other chronic wounds which have not healed in a reasonable amount of time. Some of the leading-edge treatments offered include negative pressure wound therapy, debridement, application of cellular-based tissue or skin substitutes to the wound, offloading or total contact casts and hyperbaric oxygen therapy.

The rising incidence of chronic wounds can be correlated to obesity, vascular disease, an aging population, and radiation treatment side-effects which are often underlying causes. If left untreated, chronic wounds can lead to diminished quality of life and possibly amputation of an affected limb.

"We follow treatment protocols specifically established for each type of wound. We use leading approaches to wound healing and remain current in new scientific advances in wound care," said Christina Hall, director of the Wound Care Center at Atrium. "Our treatment practices and protocols are designed to reintroduce the body's innate ability to heal." The Wound Care Center is made up of a team of professionals including physicians with advanced training in wound management and hyperbaric oxygen therapy; nursing staff trained in the care of chronic wounds; technicians who perform non-invasive studies and various therapies; and experienced staff to assist with appointments, medical records, and health insurance processing.

Services are designed to complement a primary physician's care. Patients are frequently referred by their primary care physician, and the program operates by appointment. Based on an extensive evaluation, a customized treatment plan is developed to optimize the therapies best suited to address the patient's needs. Care is administered on an outpatient basis.

"This award exemplifies the services we offer at Atrium," said Rhonda Seidenschmidt, vice president of operations at Atrium. "Atrium Medical Center offers a wide range of nationally recognized services at a convenient location that saves our patients a drive to Cincinnati or Dayton."
